ROUTE & TRAVEL NOTES

"All that is within me cries out to go back to my home on the Hudson River" — During his presidency, Franklin Delano Roosevelt spent a great deal of time at his Hyde Park home, where he could enjoy quiet reflection and solitude away from Washington. Shortly before his death, Roosevelt donated his home and 33 acres to the public. Today his home - together with his Presidential Library, a museum. and his private retreat, Top Cottage - are a popular National Historic Site.

Beloved first lady - Eleanor Roosevelt, too, had a home away from home. At Val-Kill she wrote, enjoyed family activities, and entertained leaders from around the world. Visitors today can walk on the same loop trail she often used.

Making connections — The Hyde Park trail system connects the community's most notable historic sites: the FDR Home and Library, Val-Kill, Top Cottage, and the Vanderbilt Mansion, as well as Pinewoods, Hackett Hill Park, and the Winnakee Land Trust's Nature Preserve, For more information visit www.hydeparkny.us or call (845) 229-8086.
