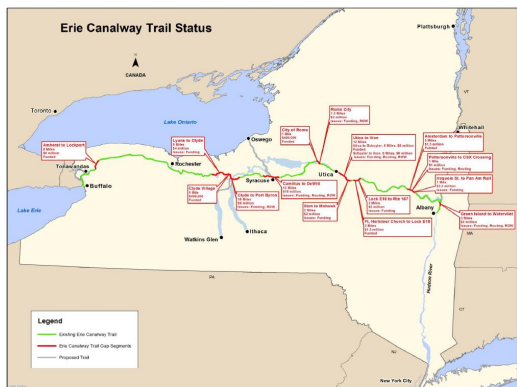
Canal Clean Sweep celebrates 10th anniversary

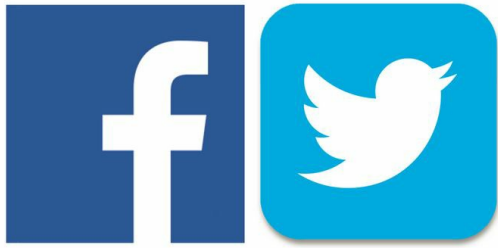
Eyes on the prize - a completed Erie Canalway Trail
