Western NY Trail Town Program

The Western NY Trail Town Program, made possible with support from the Ralph C. Wilson Jr. Foundation, offers technical assistance and recognition to communities along the Genesee Valley Greenway State Park that are ready to embrace outdoor recreation as a driver of economic growth, community pride, and quality of life.

Through the Western NY Trail Town Program, PTNY helps participating towns strengthen connections between their downtowns, trails, and recreational assets — helping to develop a network of stakeholders and a long-term plan to transform them into destinations where residents and visitors alike can explore, stay, and thrive.

Program Benefits

Selected towns will receive:

- Nine months of hands-on technical assistance from PTNY
- Workshops and community engagement events, including a *Bike Around Assessment* and *Placemaking Workshop*
- A custom Trail Town Action Agenda, outlining short- and long-term goals for trail-related investments
- Eligibility for [Western NY Trail Town grants](#) upon completion of the program and other grants-related assistance
- Access to a regional network of other Trail Towns working to grow recreation and economic opportunity

Who Can Apply

Eligible applicants include municipalities located directly adjacent or within one mile of the **Genesee Valley Greenway State Park**. Applications must demonstrate municipal support and include at least one committed community partner organization (such as a Main Street association, recreation or conservation group, or service club). How to Apply

Applications close **February 16, 2026 at 11:59 PM.**

To apply, complete this online Trail Town application and submit required materials, including:

- A municipal resolution or letter of support
- A letter of support from a community organization
- Details about local amenities, assets, and potential Trail Town steering committee members

Selected communities will be notified in mid-March 2026 and begin the program in spring 2026.
