A big anniversary comes with some serious stock-taking, and we doubled-down in 2025, ensuring that our work is truly aligned with the needs of our community and our network of parks, trails, and public lands.

In 2025 we undertook a strategic planning initiative, getting critical feedback from partners, supporters, and other stakeholders to best understand who we are, what we've accomplished, and where we should be going. And the feedback? We are a trusted partner who is accessible and has an outsized impact. As an organization deeply committed to the relationships we hold, we couldn't have received a better anniversary present!

And we carried that energy into our work this past year. Thanks to our dedicated advocacy, we saw a critical increase in our **Park and Trail Partnership Grant Program (\$2.5m!)** and the **Connect Kids to Parks Program (\$3.8m!)** which gets Title I schoolchildren out into nature to learn. Investments like these are crucial for the wellbeing not only of New York's public lands, but the communities who rely on them.

We also hosted the **first Greenways Conference in a decade**, bringing together 200 trail planners, advocates, government officials and community leaders in Kingston to ideate a strong path forward for New York's greenways network. And the outcomes? A very happy, and engaged, group of trail stewards committed to the future of the economic, environmental, and community health an expanded trail network will bring. The Greenways Conference helped us prime the proverbial pump for the next massive investment in New York's multi-use trails, and with a strong coalition behind us, PTNY is ready for the fight.



Uniting Advocates

PTNY CONVENES FOR GREENWAYS GROWTH

The first convening of its kind in over a decade, the Empire State Greenways Conference brought together more than 200 trail planners, advocates, government officials, and community leaders from across the state. Held October 15–17, 2025 in Kingston, NY, the Conference marked a defining moment for New York’s growing greenway movement, priming advocates to fight for the next major investment in New York’s multi-use trail network.

Over three energizing days of field visits, workshops, and discussions, attendees explored not just where the greenways network stands today, but where it is headed next. The message was clear... New York is at a pivotal point, and the decisions made now will shape the next decade of trail development.

The conference struck a celebratory tone while also leaning into urgency. Across sessions, five major themes emerged: access and accessibility, sustainable funding, advocacy and promotion, thoughtful planning and design, and community safety. Together, they reflect a growing recognition that greenways are more than recreational amenities; they are essential community and economic infrastructure that connect people, places, and opportunities.

Several key takeaways are now helping guide PTNY’s work moving forward.

First, the need for dedicated, reliable statewide funding stood out as a top priority. While many trail projects are shovel-ready, progress often stalls without consistent investment. Participants emphasized that funding must extend beyond construction to include long-term maintenance—ensuring trails remain safe, welcoming, and well cared for over time.

Second, there was strong alignment around designing trails as part of a broader active transportation network. This means thinking beyond standalone segments and instead building systems that connect communities to schools, transit, workplaces, and downtowns. Safe crossings, accessible design, and data-informed planning all play a role in making trails viable for everyday use, not just recreation.

Collaboration also emerged as a cornerstone of success. The conference highlighted that a seamless, statewide greenway network cannot be built in isolation. It requires coordinated partnerships among state agencies, local governments, nonprofits, land trusts, utilities, and community groups. Thanks to PTNY and partners’ work, many of these collaborations are already taking shape, demonstrating what is possible when stakeholders align around a shared vision.

Finally, while the short-term federal funding outlook may be uncertain, momentum at the state and local levels is strong. Rather than waiting, communities are preparing by advancing plans, building partnerships, and positioning projects to move quickly when resources become available.

In many ways, the conference marked a shift. Instead of asking why greenways matter, focus moved to delivering them effectively and equitably while prioritizing growing New York’s network. It was a celebration of progress, but also a rallying point for what comes next.

And what comes next will—if advocates are successful—be truly transformative. PTNY and partners are actively working toward the next massive investment in New York’s greenway network, focusing on creating 1,200 more miles of trail to connect tens of thousands of New Yorkers to the economic, health, and community benefits of active transportation infrastructure.



Celebrating Major Clean Sweep and Erie Canal Anniversaries

You might know that the Erie Canal celebrated its 200th anniversary in 2025, but did you know that one of PTNY's core volunteer events also enjoyed a pivotal birthday?

Canal Clean Sweep (CCS)—PTNY's Earth Day cleanup of New York's Canalway Trails—celebrated 20 years from April 18-20! CCS, run in partnership with New York State Canal Corporation, has been a community staple for two decades now, preparing these beloved greenway trails for the influx of spring and summer visitors (an estimated 3.97m in 2024!). 2025 saw more than 150 clean-up events held, with an estimated turnout of over 2,000 volunteers.

CCS has made a huge difference for the 291 miles of Canalway Trails since its inception and has grown accordingly. Originally a two-week event, CCS was meant to highlight the significance of the Erie Canal System as a recreational land tourism destination in New York. Now, it takes place over three days, and 2025 saw 2,417 volunteers collect more than 48,132 lbs of trash and donate 7,251 hours. CCS creates a sense of ownership of local trails for communities and has led to the creation of 11 Adopt-A-Trail groups, such as the Rotary Club of Rochester Southwest, an inclusive and diverse group of change makers. Since September 2020, the club has adopted a two-plus mile stretch of the Canalway trail in southwest Rochester. They routinely beautify the trail on the third Saturday of each month and organize an annual event along the Canalway and Genesee Riverway Trails called Roc River Ride.

Breaking Report for 2026

PTNY, along with partners State Parks, the Hudson River Valley Greenway, and NYS Canal Corporation, is undertaking a first-of-its-kind study to determine the impacts of New York's greenway networks.

Begun in 2025 with LaBella Associates and the Institute for Transportation Research and Education at North Carolina State University, the study will assess how trails support tourism, local businesses, regional economies, and community health across the state. It will underscore the growing role that trail infrastructure plays in strengthening communities and the state economy, and may be the most comprehensive study of greenways' impact in the United States to date.

Given PTNY and partners' focus on winning the next major investment in the New York's greenways network—a goal of \$1-\$2b over the next five years—the Economic Impact Report will be a critical resource in arguing for such transformational funding.

The Report's release is planned for June 2026, so keep your eyes peeled for this vital piece of advocacy support!

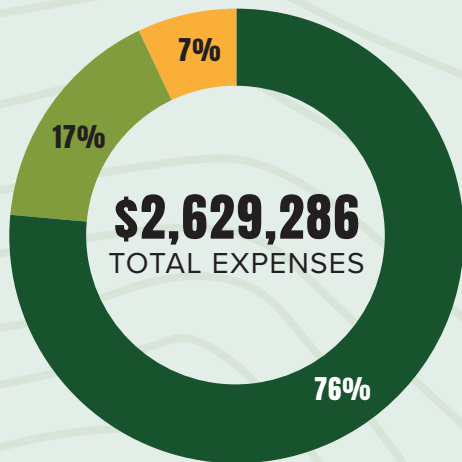

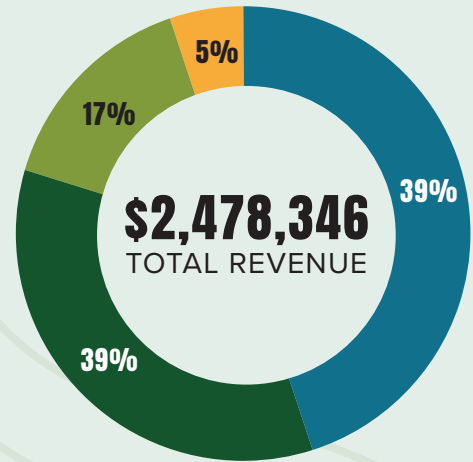
