



Parks and Greenway Trails Are Essential Infrastructure

Appendices

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This report is based on a statewide survey commissioned by Parks & Trails New York and conducted by Embold Research between May 7 and May 14, 2026. Embold surveyed 1,502 likely New York voters online using a representative sample drawn from across the state. Responses were weighted by age, gender, race and ethnicity, education, geographic region, and voting behavior. The modeled margin of sampling error is ± 2.7 percentage points; margins may vary for individual subgroups.

Survey topics included: use of parks and outdoor recreation areas; attitudes toward parks, trails, and public lands; walking and bicycling behavior; transportation priorities and street design; public safety; greenway expansion; and the economic and community benefits of parks and trails. Where appropriate, survey findings are supplemented by data from *The Economic Impact of the Empire State Trail Report*, published by Parks & Trails New York in partnership with LaBella Associates in 2026, and publicly available information on New York's transportation, parks, and environmental initiatives.

Public Methodology Statement

METHODOLOGY

Embold surveyed 1,502 likely voters in the NY state general election from May 7 - 14, 2026. We used the following sources to recruit respondents:

- *targeted advertisements on Facebook and Instagram, as well as across the web via Facebook's ad platform (1061 responses)*
- *text messages sent, via the Echo19 platform, to cell phone numbers listed on the voter file for individuals who qualified for the survey's sample universe, based on their voter file data (440 responses)*

Regardless of which source a respondent came from, they were directed to a survey hosted on SurveyMonkey's website.

Ads placed on social media targeted likely voters in the NY state general election. Those who indicated that they were not registered to vote were terminated. As the survey fielded, Embold used dynamic online sampling: adjusting ad budgets, lowering budgets for ads targeting groups that were overrepresented, and raising budgets for ads targeting groups that were underrepresented, so that the final sample was roughly representative of the population across different groups. The survey was conducted in English.

The survey was commissioned by Parks and Trails NY and conducted online by Embold. Post-stratification was performed on age, gender, education, race/ethnicity, and region. Weighting parameters are based on the demographic composition of registered voters in the state, based on voter file data. That is, if x% of registered voters in the state were women, women would be weighted to x%. 2024 general election data was based on data from the New York Secretary of State.

The modeled margin of error for this survey is 2.7%, which uses effective sample sizes** that adjust for the design effect of weighting. This research, like all public opinion research, does entail some additional unmeasured error.*

* We adopt The Pew Research Center's convention for the term "modeled margin of error"(1) (mMOE) to indicate that our surveys are not simple random samples in the pure sense, similar to any survey that has either non-response bias or for which the general population was not invited at random. A common, if imperfect, convention for reporting survey results is to use a single, survey-level mMOE based on a normal approximation. This is a poor approximation for proportion estimates close to 0 or 1. However, it is a useful communication tool in many settings and is reasonable in places where the proportion of interest is close to 50%. We report this normal approximation for our surveys assuming a proportion estimate of 50%.

** The effective sample size adjusts for the weighting applied to respondents and is calculated using Kish's approximation (2).
